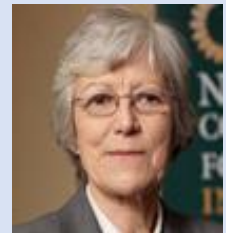

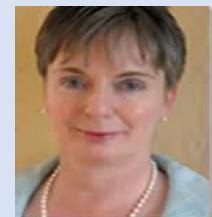
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Speakers:

Patricia Rickard-Clarke is a solicitor and former Commissioner of the Law Reform Commission. She is the independent Chair of the National Safeguarding Committee for adults who may be vulnerable, Chair of Third Age's National Advisory Committee for Sage - Support and Advocacy Service for Older People and a member of the Board of Third Age CLG, and Chair of the Law Society's Mental Health and Capacity Task Force. She is a member of the Council of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland and a member of the National Assisted Decision-Making Steering Group of the HSE. She contributed the Irish section of International Protection of Adults which was published by Oxford University Press in 2015.



Mary Condell is a solicitor and mediator being a Practitioner member of the MII. She also holds an MA in Mediation and Conflict Intervention. She is legal advisor to Sage – Support and Advocacy Services for Older People, advising on legal issues arising in advocate's casework and educating professionals and others about the new capacity legislation and its practical application in dealing with vulnerable adults. She is a member of the Law Society's Task Force on Mental Capacity established to review and make submissions on the new capacity legislation. She is co-founder and former chair of Solicitors for the Elderly in Ireland and former chair of Society of Trust and Estate Practitioners in Ireland.



Amanda Phelan is an Assistant Professor in the UCD School of Nursing, Midwifery & Health Systems. She holds a number of roles such as Associate Dean for Global Engagement, Subject Head in Older Persons' Nursing and Deputy Director of the National Centre for the Protection of Older People.
